





Newcomers 40th Anniversary



Entering its 40th year, Falmouth Newcomers is a vibrant and active club with over 700 members and more than 70 activities. But it didn't start out that way! Someone had to invest in the idea initially, and others had to nurture it along the way. Since our past Presidents have a unique window into the Club's history and growth, we asked them for their thoughts, which we are sharing on a monthly basis in this newsletter article.

Reflections of Newcomers Club Past President Margaret Souza

I was president in 2018-2019. Being new to Falmouth and relatively new to Newcomers it was quite a challenge. When I moved here, I only knew one person with whom I had previously worked. Thus, Newcomers enabled me to find a new home in Falmouth with a host of new relationships. Serving on the Board to give back was important to me. What made it memorable was the dedication of the individuals on the Board that year and how willing they were to enhance the Club. I was fortunate to have an incredibly active, committed, hardworking and creative board.

Since assuming the role of President was so challenging, we created the position of Executive Vice President, so that person could watch and learn from the current President and be ready to take over that role the following year. In the same vein, for many of the board functions, we created the notion of a vice president (VP) who held the position for one year and an assistant VP (AVP) who was new to the board. The VP mentored the AVP, giving the new board members an understanding of their role and lessening the learning curve. This system allows for continuity, but also the opportunity for new ideas. The Nominating Committee began a process of meeting with members who were interested in serving on the Board to discuss the role and what they could bring to the position. All of these changes meant a review and revision of the board bylaws. Board members volunteered to join me in the task and new ideas emerged from this work.

At that time, when members needed to identify a catering company or a venue, they had to conduct the research anew each year. It was suggested that a resource document be online, that could be a living document with information on caterers, venues, key contacts, etc. A group of volunteers was established to welcome new members to the club and assist them with questions they may have. The service exchange was established to help members with their household tasks when needed. New activities began such as the Singles group, and what eventually became the Preview group. Grand Circle tour company informed us that the company would provide a discount if the club had a certain number of members who would want to travel together. The Socials VPs took responsibility and the international trips that have occurred are the result of their work.

The highlight of my tenure was the installation event at the end of my presidency celebrating the 35th anniversary of Newcomers. The program chairs planned a very special evening at Highfield Hall. The founder of Newcomers, Marie Feeney, gave an interesting talk of how it all began in her home, as she also did at our recent 40th anniversary event.

It is my belief that each Board stands on the shoulders of the prior Boards and each is called to contribute to move the club forward. Some of the changes we implemented have taken different directions, but all of the improvements have contributed to the Club's continued growth and success. None of what happened in that year could have been accomplished without the incredible board members with whom I was privileged to serve and am so thankful for their service. Book Nook



The Women by Kristin Hannah Recommended by Monica G. Rudolph

I believe we all grew up during the Vietnam War era, we saw our high school friends afraid of the draft, some choosing to defect to Canada. Back then women were only expected to do no more than get married and bear children, not that that is not a noble job. This is the story of a young woman from a prominent California family, Frankie, whose best friend was her older brother, Finley. It was a time of unrest in the country, many young people

were against the war. Finley's long family heritage expected their sons to go to war and protect their country. Their Dad had a Heroes Wall of photographs of past family men who had served. Finley was sent to Vietnam where he died in a helicopter crash, no remains found. Just before they received that devastating news, Frankie enlisted in the Army as a nurse, the only part of the service that did not require two years of stateside training before being shipped to Vietnam. She wanted to go where her brother was stationed. The story tells us about the horrors and trying times of all our dedicated service members.

I have always enjoyed reading Kristin Hannah's historical novels, they teach us so much about our history! Even though I lived through the time of the Vietnam War, I could never imagine the horrors and the inhumane conditions that the medical service men and women had to endure. Then when they finally got home, the anger and disrespect they received from their own countrymen was extremely sad and baffling. The story carries on with the trouble Frankie had trying to fit into the society she left so long ago. I thoroughly enjoyed this novel and learned so much from it.



New Activities Forming:

Quilting Group

Now forming. Are you a quilter? A group for quilters is now in the process of forming. At this point, the leader is trying to gauge interest and experience levels before determining specific meeting times and locations. Falmouth Photography Group

A new activity is starting in September for those interested in improving their photography skills while meeting like-minded people who love to go out into the "field" to shoot their subjects. This activity will initially focus on wildlife, landscapes, sunset and sunrise, and nighttime (Milky Way; Moon: Stars) photography. The locations will all occur in Falmouth, and be based on the subject of the photography shoot for that month. Discussions in the field will focus on determining the appropriate camera settings to best capture an image under a given set of environmental conditions and composing an image to enhance the beauty of the subject; post-processing of the image can be incorporated



into the photography workflow based on the activity members' interests. The group can gather at various member's houses a few days after a photographic shoot to review images captured and provide constructive criticism to improve our photographic skillset. This activity is intended for beginner to intermediate level photographers, and will incorporate some instruction of photographic basics (i.e., the Exposure Triangle) coupled with "hands-on" instruction for those less familiar with the operations of their camera. Our goal is to have fun while improving our photography skills, so all interested photographers are invited to participate! This activity is not intended for cell-phone photography.

Format: Monthly Photography shoot in the field followed a week later by a gathering at a member's house (rotate monthly) to review the pictures and provide constructive criticism.

Requirements: DSLR or mirrorless camera allowing for some degree of "customization"; the goal is to move away from the "Automatic" dial setting to "Manual" control.

Fitness Level: Minimal walking may be required on some photography shoots, but always on well-maintained trails.

Photography Skill Level: This activity will be suitable for beginners to intermediate level photographers; experts are invited, too and may be asked to assist in instruction.

The Hurricane of 1938: Memories of the Storm of the Century

Thursday, September 12th, 4pm Museums on the Green

In September 1938, New England was hit by a devastating hurricane. There was no warning. No one was prepared. Cities were flooded with up to 20 feet of water, entire seaside communities were washed away, and hundreds of lives were lost.
